2	Presentation of overview of the magistrate's court system and participative sentencing exercise - Mark Beattie & Jayanti Durai:		
	MB and JD outlined that the purpose of the magistrate's court is for 'local people to sentence local crime'. It acts independently of the political process, the police and the carrying out of sentences.		
	The actions of the court are steered by legal guidelines and can take into account advice and requirements from other agencies. An example of this is community impact statements; these suggest compensation in cases in which an offence is part of a neighbourhood wide problem.		
	A number of sentencing options are available that take into account guidelines including culpability and whether the offender pleads guilty at an early opportunity.		
	DISCHARGE - FINE - COMMUNITY ORDER - PRISON		
	Based on the offence and sentence the amount and type of compensation is decided, factoring in the cost in real terms and the appropriateness based on the offender's resources.		
	Of interest to the panel were the ways in which it is possible to become involved in drawing up community impact statements for the court to deliberate. At present the statements usually deal with the impacts of anti-social behaviour and are submitted by the police as long as they are connected to a particular offence.

	Barnard Park- use of the ball courts eased the levels of anti-social behaviour for a short period, however the area is still suffering from dog fouling and large groups congregating.		l
	Huntingdon Street – P M criticised the effectiveness of the parks line because of cost and said that there were still groups of youths with dogs loitering in the area. It was decided that Justin & Stephanie at Magpi would liaise with the police regarding implementing flashcam cctv that identifies subjects that are stationary for a long period.		
	Huntingdon Street to Richmond Avenue – a burglary hotspot however in a borough wide context it is not a huge problem. According to M A, this area will be offered Smart Water packs that identify stolen property as belonging to the owner.		
	Drybos – were discussed in relation to the particular problem of drinking and anti-social behaviour in the ward, however it was discovered they will be of limited use as a tool to cut down occasional cases.
