Safer Caledonian

Tackling anti-social behaviour on the Westbourne Estate

The Caledonian ward panel made the Westbourne Estate a priority for police patrols after problems with anti-social behaviour (ASB) from a group of young people. The young people involved were identified – most were not from the Westbourne estate – and their names were given to Homes for Islington (HFI), who manage the estate.

Those young people and their parents, were invited to the offices of HFI where they were all asked to sign Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs). There has been a reduction in ASB on the Westbourne Estate since this action was taken.

We looked around the estate with HFI and Islington Council to identify anti-social behaviour hotspots and to look at what we could do to discourage young people from gathering in these areas.

Youth clubs are taking place three times a week locally, which help to divert young people from crime. On Monday evenings a youth club meets at the Westbourne Community Hall, on Thursday evenings a youth club runs at Nailour Community Hall, Blundell Street, and on Friday evenings a youth club runs at Jean Stokes Hall on the Bemerton Estate.

More localised policing

Islington Police have responded to residents' concerns by increasing their focus on neighbourhood policing, developing a Safer Neighbourhoods (SN) Task Force who will work with the existing Safer Neighbourhoods teams to tackle problems such as large groups of young people gathering on estates, anti-social behaviour on mopeds, drugs and drug dealing and undercover operations.



And more police on the beat

Islington Council is funding a South Islington problem-solving police team. This new police team will provide extra cover at weekends and evenings, and will focus on problem areas such as housing estates and parks.

We already have a North Islington problem-solving police team, which has been working with Safer Neighbourhoods teams to tackle long-standing anti-social behaviour problems.

Preventing prostitutes advertising their services

A team of Special Constables, led by acting Special Sergeant Ray Brandon tackled the persistent problem of prostitute advertising cards littering the phone boxes in the Kings Cross area. This led to a reduction in the number of cards left in the kiosks and the arrest of a prolific offender.

Have you got what it takes?

Safer, cleaner Cally

Teams from Islington Council, the police and HFI are teaming up in local areas across Islington for a blitz on litter, dirt, dog mess and anti-social behaviour in regular "Safer, Cleaner" days we will be holding throughout the year.

Teams have been out and about in the Caledonian Road area, carrying out a range of work, including grounds maintenance, clearing bulk refuse, litter and overgrowth, and graffiti removal. Caledonian SNT patrolled the area giving out information to residents on safety and how to report issues or concerns.

The aim of the days is to blitz a particular area, usually where we have had an increase in resident concerns or that have been identified as "hotspot areas" for anti-social behaviour. If you report a problem, we will act.

End of the road for illegal minicabs

Islington Council is working with the police, Transport for London and other partners to tackle:

- Illegal parking
- Illegal vehicles
- Misuse of disabled blue badges
- Large groups of cab drivers on the street
- Cab drivers dropping litter

Local residents and businesses complained to Islington Council about mini cab firms along Cally Road and Bridgeman Road and Bingfield and Northdown Streets. We ran checks on parking, drivers and vehicles to ensure they were not breaking the law.

Over the last year we have made 59 visits to minicab offices across Islington, and inspected 328 minicabs. Forty-two of these were found to be unfit for use. Please use a licensed minicab office – if you have any concerns or suspicions, please report them. Go to www.islington.gov.uk/safer to find out how you can check if your local cab firm or driver is licensed.

Make sure your bike isn't just for Christmas

If you got a nice new bike for Christmas, make sure you lock it securely to make it harder for thieves to steal.

Islington Police have been using decoy bikes in hotspots to catch would-be thieves, and have already made six arrests in one hotspot area. Two cycle shops are offering a 10% discount on all safety and security items to cyclists who have a safer bikes voucher. The shops taking part are Mosquito Bikes, 123 Essex Road, and Finsbury Cycles, 185 Seven Sisters Road.

Caledonian SNT will be handing out vouchers, contact us to find out how you can get yours.

For simple tips to prevent your bike being stolen, or to download a discount voucher, go to **www.islington.gov.uk/saferbikes**.

Remember; **always** lock your bike — even if you are leaving it on a shared balcony or hallway.

And register your bike at **www.immobilise.com** so if it is stolen, police can return it.
